

## 3210 Activities

1. Maeser encourages students to participate in school activities, including extracurricular activities because they provide opportunities for personal growth and contribute to a well-rounded education.
  - a. Extracurricular activities include, but are not limited to: baseball, Broadway Rocks, basketball, cross country, debate, drama, golf, orchestra (solo & ensemble competitions), Shakespeare, soccer, Student Council, swimming, tennis, track & field, volleyball, and ultimate frisbee.
  - b. Since academic performance is a *high priority* at Maeser, students must achieve “academic eligibility” in order to participate in *any* extracurricular activity
2. Academic Eligibility for Activities
  - a. Students must earn a minimum 2.7 GPA with no Fs/NGs from the previous term in which the activity is occurring.
    - i. For example, basketball starts in November so a student’s 1st term grades would determine eligibility for participating in this 2nd term activity.
  - b. High school students who have any Fs/NGs from any previous high school courses will be required to make-up the F and/or NG in order to be eligible.
    - i. For example, if a junior failed his/her Socratic 9 course, he/she will be required to make-up this course before participation in a sport/activity can occur.
  - c. Students must be enrolled at Maeser “full time,” which means students must be enrolled in at least 6 classes.
  - d. Students must have all necessary forms filled out, signed, and on file with the office and have all fees paid.
3. Maeser Activities
  - a. As a public school and member of the Utah High School Activities Association (UHSAA), Maeser abides by all applicable laws and UHSAA policies.
  - b. Students who are participating in gender-specific activities must participate according to the sex on their birth certificate.
    - i. Students who wish to participate in a gender-specific activity with a gender that is different from what appears on their birth certificate must follow the procedure outlined by state law and UHSAA policy.
    - ii. This policy applies to all Maeser activities, even those that are not governed by the UHSAA.

- c. While participating in any Maeser activities, students must use changing and bathroom facilities that align with the sex on their birth certificate, or a single-occupant bathroom if available or if required.
  - i. This policy applies to all Maeser activities, even those not governed by UHSAA.
